
Thunderbird/1965

Chunderbird Convertible



Thunderbird Convertible tops are 5-ply construction with a vinyl coating for greater durability, and are offered in four colors. Most are available with any of Thunderbird's 20 Diamond Lustre Enamel exterior color choices and 19 upholstery selections (which include six luxurious leather and vinyl options). Luxury is everywhere, as in all Thunderbirds. Seats are deep-foam padded . . . upholsteries richly pleated. There is a remote-control mirror for the driver . . . courtesy lighting to serve you all about. And even the AM radio is included as standard equipment.












Thunderbird Landau Interior


Inside the Landau, there are rich appointments on every side. Warm-toned panels of simulated walnut in doors, control panel and console. Wood-grained steering wheel with a recessed, padded hub. As in all models, dual-lens door lights . . . a clear beam to light your entry, a red beam to warn approaching traffic. A console storage compartment with padded top which serves as a center arm rest for driver or front seat passenger. The elegantly coved, spacious rear seat with its pull-down center arm rest. Convenience in even the smallest details: a unique double-sided door-ignition key you could use blindfolded. Comfort supreme: shell-contour seats even provide more footroom for rear-seat passengers. You can select from four separate vinyl roof colors: black, white, blue or brown. With few exceptions, you can match them to Thunderbird's 20 exterior colors of gem-bright Diamond Lustre Enamel. And for the interior, 19 upholsteries to suit any taste . . . including six trim options of top grain leather and vinyl.







Touch is in a ride of such smoothness that it is often compared to flight itself. Thunderbird's jet-age instrumentation is complemented by this 5-in-1 option. Toggle switches actuate safety flasher (parking and taillights) and automatic door locks. Warning lights in between signal that safety flasher is operative, "low fuel," and "door ajar." F Deep-Well Trunk. Surprisingly roomy, the 11.5-cu. ft. Thunderbird trunk has a deep well so that large luggage can be loaded and carried upright. And there is generous room all around for additional luggage. More evidence of the Thunderbird touch: the trunk is fully lined to protect your luggage and, for your convenience, is automatically lighted at night.

In addition to its impressive standard equipment roster, Thunderbird offers a number of options with which you can personalize the model of your choice exactly to your taste. SELECTAIRE CONDITIONER gives you control of the weather wherever you drive your Thunderbird. Cooling for summer, heating for winter; precise controls to "adjust" the climate to your preference. AM-FM RADIO: five push buttons can be tuned to your favorite AM stations, or static-free FM stations, or any combination of the two. RECLINING PASSENGER SEAT lets you relax, even nap under way. Seat-side control lets you tilt seat, lock it in place. Upper cushion extends to serve as a most comfortable headrest. New POWER VENT WINDOWS with POWER SIDE WINDOWS and POWER SEATS are separate options which can be teamed up to make your Thunderbird nearly 100% automatic. Also for your consideration: Safety-Convenience Control Panel (shown and described on previous page); Full Wheel Covers with Simulated Knock-Off Hubs; Rear Radio Speakers (regular or Studio-Sonic): Electric Power Radio Antenna: "Red Band" White Sidewall Tires (as illustrated throughout this catalog): Automatic Speed Control; Tinted Glass; Leather and Vinyl Upholstery Combinations (choice of 6), and others.







Diamond Lustre Enamel in 20 single tones (all models), 24 two-tone combinations (Hardtop). Color-keyed trim selections: 3 cloth/vinyl, 10 all-vinyl, 6 genuine leather and vinyl (optional). Your Ford Dealer will be most happy to show you exact samples of Thunderbird colors and trims.

Maintenance—In addition to 100,000-mile (or 3-year, whichever comes first) major chassis lubrication interval, Thunderbird offers the convenience of twice-a-year (or every 6000-mile) oil changes and minor lubrications.

Engine—300-hp Thunderbird Special V-8, displ. 390 cu. in.; 4.05" bore x 3.78" stroke; 10.1 to 1 comp. ratio; 4-barrel/automatic choke carburetor; premium fuel; dual exhaust system. Thunderbird V-8 engine features include: aluminized/stainless steel mufflers; 36,000-mile (or 3-year) fuel filter; 36,000-mile (or 3-year) dry-type air cleaner; 6000-mile (or 6-month) Full-Flow oil filter; aluminized valves; hydraulic lifters; 190" thermostat; 36,000-mile/2-year coolant-antifreeze (available—installed in production); 12-volt electrical system; 42-amp. alternator; 55 amp-hr "Sta-Ful" battery.

Front Suspension - Angle-Poised ball joints; widebase coil springs. Rubber-insulated struts permit tion interval: ball joints 100,000 miles or 3 years.

Rear Suspension—Extra-long, variable-rate leaf springs with rear axie located forward of center. Springs rubber-cushioned at front, at tension-type shackles and at axie.

Brakes—Self-adjusting power brakes. Front: calipertype disc brakes with high fade-resistant characteristics. Rear: drum-shoe type brakes, drums crossribbed and flared for fade resistance. Total swept area 408 sq. in.

Transmission—Cruise-O-Matic Drive. Two selective ranges: "Drive" position (green dot) starting in low for normal driving—or alternate "Drive" position (white dot) starting in intermediate for more surefooted acceleration on slippery surfaces.

Drive—Hotchkiss. Semi-floating hypoid rear axle; straddle-mounted drive pinion. Permanently lubricated wheel bearings. Axle ratio 3.00 to 1.

Steering—New design integral power steering. Swing-Away Wheel. Steering linkage lubricated for 100,000 miles or 3 years. Overall ratio 20.4 to 1. Turning diameter 40.2 ft. wineers and times—True-center wheers on precisionmachined hubs. Low-profile tires built to rigid Thunderbird specifications; 8.15 x 15 on 5½" safety

Dimensions and Capacities—113" wheelbase, 61" front, 60" rear treads: 205.4" length; 77.3" width; 52.5" (Hdtp.), 52.6" (Landau), 53.3" (Convert.) designload height; fuel 22 gal.; oil 6 qt. with filter change; cooling system (with heater) 20.5 qt.; trunk luggage vol. 11.5 cu. ft. (all models—Convert. top up).
