Other '70 service-savers include 24,000-mile (or 2-year) engine coolant-antifreeze, self-adjusting brakes, long-life Sta-Ful battery, shielded alternator, rust- and corrosion-resistant aluminized muffler and galvanized major underbody parts.

Your new 1970 Falcon comes equipped with factory engineered and approved parts such as the dependable Autolite Sta-Ful battery, Autolite Power-Tip spark plugs, Autolite shock absorbers, and an Autolite 6000-mile oil filter. For continued top performance, be sure to specify genuine Autolite parts whenever replacement is necessary.
