interior, which is shown and described on page 10.
















# MARQUIS CONVERTIBLE

The high standards of luxury and elegance set by Marquis are in no way compromised in the convertible. It displays the same distinctive Marquis flair, with ventless side windows featuring a pronounced glass curvature, concealed headlamps and full-width taillamps. Mercury's 429 cubic inch V-8 is standard along with Select-Shift automatic transmission. Smartly tailored all-vinyl interiors in a wide range of colors especially reflect Marquis elegance. There is an unusual amount of room in the rear seat, and the scratch-resistant, non-yellowing tempered glass rear window folds up and down with the top without having to be zippered in and out.


At the top of the right hand page is shown the tastefully elegant Marquis interior with cloth-and-vinyl bench seat and




new simulated dark teakwood appliqués. The new luxury steering wheel with rim blow horn, an electric clock and a number of courtesy lights are standard.

# MARAUDER X-100 AND MARAUDER

A dramatic and highly distinctive roof design with tunneled rear window immediately distinguishes the Marauder and Marauder X-100. An optional two-tone paint treatment for the rear deck can add to their distinction. 

The Marauder X-100 with its standard 360 horsepower, 429-4V V-8 engine and Select-Shift automatic transmission fully qualifies as an all-out performance machine. Luxury wheel covers, fender skirts on the rear quarter panels and white sidewall belted wide tread tires are also standard equipment.


