


It's in the nature of things for Cadillac to lead the way.

Even if you're well-aware of Cadillac accomplishments, you might be surprised by the scope of our involvement in two areas of such great concern today —safer highways and cleaner air.

Did you know, for instance, that Cadillac was the first to equip cars with electric starting, lighting and ignition back in 1912? That Cadillac was also first to use tilt-beam headlights for better night driving visibility in 1915? First to install safety glass in 1928? And that Cadillac introduced the triple-braking system in 1962? The Cadillacs of 1972, of course, incorporate a host of safety advances. Including an energy absorbing steering column. Padded instrument panel.

Safety steering wheel. Seat belts with pushbutton buckles for all passenger positions, plus shoulder belts for the driver and right front passenger. Front-seat head restraints. Passenger-guard door locks. Side-Guard steel beams in the doors. Four-way hazard warning flasher. And, many, many others (see listing of safety features on specifications page).

Or were you aware that since 1960, we





have, on the average, reduced hydrocarbon emissions in our cars 80% and carbon monoxide emissions about two-thirds? But the work goes on. We are engaged in two massive efforts: The first to make highway travel ever safer. The second to remove the automobile as a significant factor in air pollution—and to do it as quickly as possible. Cadillac is doing something about traffic safety and air pollution, but of course, there are some things only you can do.

For safety's sake, we suggest the following rules to live by:

- 1. Always use your seat and shoulder belts. 2. Make sure your car is in good running order—paying particular attention to headlights, turn signals, tires and brakes. 3. Never drive when you're tired or under the influence of alcohol.
- 4. Support driver training and uniform traffic codes and enforcement. 5. Drive defensively. Always assume the other person is going to do the wrong thing. For cleaner air, we suggest these six simple steps:
- 1. Have your PCV (positive crankcase ventilation) valve cleaned regularly.
- 2. Make sure your carburetor is properly adjusted. It's relatively easy to do and it can save you money, too. 3. Have your air filter cleaned or replaced regularly.
- 4. Use no-lead or low-lead fuels. All 1972 Cadillacs operate efficiently on them.
- 5. Avoid prolonged idling. It produces the highest concentration of pollutants.
- 6. Keep your spark plugs and points in good condition. Getting a tune-up regularly is a most effective way to reduce emissions.




CALAIS COUPE IN SUMATRA GREEN WITH A 1914 CADILLAC FIVE-PASSENGER TOURING CAR.



The look of luxury is everywhere in the Calais Coupe. In the new Mayfair Cloth upholstery fabric, that comes with vinyl bolster, in any of six colors. Or in expanded vinyl upholstery, an added luxury, available in either Antique Saddle or Black, as shown here. It also shows in the many other

luxury features available for your added pleasure. And you can see it in the many extra touches that tell you this is a Cadillac—such as a front center armrest, an electric clock, flow-thru ventilation, a remote-control outside mirror, an inside hood release and even a cover for the spare tire.

Handard in great detail



One of the things that delights Cadillac owners year after year is how many luxury items, offered at extra charge on some other cars (if they are offered at all), are standard equipment on a Cadillac. Of course, the number of luxury features that are incorporated as standard equipment depends upon the specific model you select. Yet, as you will note on the following pages, many of the features provided as standard on some models are available as options on others.

One glance at the artfully curved instrument panel is enough to tell you that attention to detail is an integral part of every Cadillac. Gauges are particularly easy to see. Controls are especially easy to adjust as you drive.

DUAL COMFORT FRONT SEAT (Standard on the Brougham and available on Eldorado and DeVille models). Makes comfort an individual affair. There's one set of controls for adjustment of the driver's section and another for the wider, passenger section.

Variable-ratio Power Steering. (Fixed ratio on Seventy-Fives) Affords almost effortless parking and cornering, while retaining a reassuring feel of the road. Dual Power Brakes with Disc Brakes in Front (all models). For smooth, straight stops.

FLOW-THRU VENTILATION (all models). New system provides continuous outside air for passengers.

TURBO HYDRA-MATIC TRANSMISSION (all models).

For instant, smooth response at all speeds.

CORNERING LIGHTS (all models). These lights, on the side of front fenders, are activated by the directional signal lever when the headlamp switch is on. They project a beam of light from the side of the car to illuminate the roadside and road signs for added convenience when driving at night.














CADILLAC BUMPER SYSTEMS. All 1972 Cadillacs utilize a number of innovations for added levels of protection. First, impact strips of polyvinyl chloride have been mounted on both front and rear bumpers to lessen damage in parking or minor collisions. Second, the front bumper has been moved forward ¾" to increase yield strength, the distance the bumper yields to force and returns. This, in turn, results in front bumper deflection of 1½", the distance that the bumper moves without causing damage to the sheet metal. Another standard feature that adds to Cadillac's bumper protection is the use of front bumper guards with rubber-impact-absorption inserts and polyvinyl chloride impact strips.

POWER WINDOWS (all models). For greater comfort and convenience.

Ashtrays. Two front and two rear for all models except Fleetwood Seventy-Fives which have four rear, two in each armrest.

THREE-SPEED WINDSHIELD WIPERS AND WASHERS (all models). Concealed, glare-




GLOVE Box (all models). Incorporates the positive open/locking feature.

REAR-SEAT READING LIGHTS (Brougham).

VISOR VANITY MIRROR (all models).

STYLING FEATURES. A great number of styling features are standard on various Cadillac models. Those most notable include the jewel-like standup crest on the hood of the Eldorado. Coach windows in the Eldorado Coupe. Padded vinyl roof and the chrome molding around the rear window on the Brougham. Stainless steel rocker moldings on the DeVilles and, when you specify a vinyl roof, a halo roof molding on the Coupe. And this year, all vinyl roofs are padded.










Courtesy Lights (all models). Include a front ash receiver light, dual backup lights, rear compartment lights, directional indicators, front and rear side markers, automatic glove box and map light, an automatic luggage compartment light and lights in door panels for safety warning when door is opened (reflectors only in Calais models). The Brougham also has an adjustable reading light.


CARPETED FOOTRESTS (Brougham and Seventy-Fives). LIGHTERS. Two in front for all models. Two in rear of all models except Calais—one in rear of each Eldorado armrest and four in rear of Seventy-Fives.





rearview mirror shows if taillight and stop light/turn signals are functioning. Another monitoring system shows when windshield washer fluid is low by means of a warning light on the instrument panel.

REMOTE-CONTROL LEFT-SIDE MIRROR (all models). Right-side mirror standard on Seventy-Fives.



ELECTRIC CLOCK (all models).

Assist Straps (all models). For ease of entry and exit. Automatic Level Control (all Fleetwood models). Keeps the automobile level even with a full load.

AUTOMATIC PARKING BRAKE RELEASE (all models). Brake automatically releases when transmission is placed in "drive" or "reverse" with engine running. HEATER AND DEFROSTER (Automatic Climate Control and rear-window de-fogger are standard on Seventy-Fives). Directs an even flow of controlled warm air to both front and rear passengers, while helping keep windshield free of fog and ice.

CENTER ARMRESTS. Front and rear on DeVilles and Fleetwood Sedans, front only on Eldorado and Calais models, rear only on Limousine.

THREE CADILLAC RADIOS. Select from any of three radios with marvelous fidelity. The AM/FM unit with front and rear speakers. The exclusive AM/FM signal-seeking stereo radio with four speakers. Or the AM/FM pushbutton stereo radio with an integral eight-track tape player and four speakers. All Cadillac radios feature a ten-station tuner, permitting selection of both an AM and an FM station with each of the five pushbuttons. On the signal-seeking model, "stereo-only" stations may be selected.

RADIO FOOT CONTROL. This unit, only available with the signal-seeking radio, permits you to change stations with the tap of the toe.





AUTOMATIC CLIMATE CONTROL. Set it to the temperature you desire, and this combined heating and cooling unit—with even greater capacity for 1972—automatically cools you in the summer and warms you in the winter. In addition, it dehumidifies the passenger compartment. For severe winter weather, you may move the lever to HI, which directs all warm air toward driver and passengers; to BI-LEVEL, which directs heat to both the passenger compartment and to the windshield; or to DEF, which directs all the warm air to the windshield.

TRAILERING PACKAGE. This special factory-installed grouping of heavyduty equipment, for towing trailers weighing between 2,000 and 6,000 pounds loaded, is available on all models except Seventy-Fives. Consult your Cadillac dealer for details.

TRACK MASTER. This computerized, rear-wheel, skid-control braking system is now available on all Cadillac models.





TWILIGHT SENTINEL. This unit has two important tasks. One, it automatically turns your driving lights on or off in response to light conditions. Two, it allows you to leave headlamps and either cornering lamp on for up to 90 seconds to light your path from the car. It also includes a warning buzzer that tells you when the manual headlight switch has been pulled out and inadvertently left on after the ignition is off.



CRUISE CONTROL. A touch of this control at the tip of the directional turn signal lever, and your Cadillac automatically maintains any selected speed without using the accelerator pedal. Unit automatically disengages when you touch the brake pedal or turn off ignition.

TILT AND TELESCOPE STEERING WHEEL. Adjusts for both height and reach for driver comfort and convenience. Swings up for easier entry/exit. SIX-WAY POWER SEAT ADJUSTER. Moves front seats forward, back, up, down and tilts forward or back.



ELECTRICALLY OPERATED SUNROOF. By activating a control switch on the instrument panel, you can automatically open a panel in the roof to let the sun shine in—a little bit or as much as you like. Available on Brougham, Eldorado and DeVilles with vinyl roofs.



POWER DOOR LOCKS. A touch of the finger on this electrical control in the power grouping locks and unlocks all doors. On coupes, this feature includes an automatic seat-back release that is activated when either door is opened.

REMOTE-CONTROL TRUNK LOCK. Pressing a control button in the glove compartment releases and raises the trunk lid. To close the trunk, it is



merely necessary to bring the trunk lid to a nearly closed position where the power trunk lock takes over and latches it securely. An amber light on the instrument panel warns when the lid is unlocked.

AUTOMATIC LEVEL CONTROL. This system automatically adjusts to changing loads, to keep the car level for excellent appearance and handling.



Safety Features

The Cadillacs of 1972 incorporate an impressive array of features for increased occupant protection, accident prevention and anti-theft. Notable among these are the following:

Specifications

ENGINE: Eight-cylinder, 90° V-type. Bore 4.30, stroke 4.06, displacement 472 cu. in. Engine mounted in rubber at three points. Compression ratio 8.5 to 1.

ELDORADO ENGINE: Eight-cylinder, 90° V-type. Bore 4.30, stroke 4.304, displacement 8.2 litres. Compression ratio 8.5 to 1.

FUEL: For 1972, all Cadillac engines have been designed to operate efficiently on the new no-lead or low-lead gasolines. In addition to the lower exhaust pollutants attainable with this engine/fuel combination, there are benefits in longer life for your spark plugs, exhaust system and other engine components. If these no-lead, low-lead gasolines are not available, any leaded regular grade gasoline with a research octane number of 91 or higher may be used.

FUEL TANK CAPACITY: Approximately 27 usable gallons. Tank designed to avoid possibility of vapor or liquid fuel escaping into atmosphere.

PISTONS: Aluminum alloy, slipper-type.

CAMSHAFT: Designed with greater overlap between intake and exhaust valve timing as an aid to reducing nitrous oxides in exhaust.

CARBURETOR: Quadrajet four-barrel downdraft with equalized manifold, mechanical fuel pump, dry-type air filter and improved automatic choke. Contains new purging system for utilization of stored fuel vapors and to minimize emissions to atmosphere.

LUBRICATION: Full-pressure. Full-flow oil filter.

ELECTRICAL SYSTEM: 12-volt, 15-plate battery. Side terminals on Eldorados. 42-amp. generator. 80-amp. on all Seventy-Fives. 63-amp. on all other air conditioned cars. Generator has integral regulator on Eldorado and Seventy-Fives.

TURBO HYDRA-MATIC: Fully automatic, torqueconverter type with fixed stator. Converter multiplies engine torque for increased driving thrust to drive wheels during acceleration in any forward drive gear.

REAR AXLE: Ratio 2.93 to 1 (3.07 to 1 on Eldorado), 3.15 to 1 axle ratio is standard on Seventy-Five models, available on other models except Eldorado. Available (except Eldorado) is the controlled differential, which directs power to the rear wheel having better traction.

FRONT SUSPENSION: Integral steering knuckle for greater dependability and longer life. Independent, helical-coil-type springs. Rubber-mounted strut rods and rubber bushings absorb impacts and isolate road noise. New spindle has an integral hub and rotor. (Torsion bar suspension on Eldorado.) REAR Suspension: Four-link drive. Rear springs are helical-coil-type included on Eldorado in 1972. Large rubber bushings for quiet, soft

BRAKES: Cadillac power brakes with selfadjusting feature; composite finned rear drums; disc front. Split hydraulic master cylinder provides for independent operation of front and rear brakes. Large two-piston power booster and larger front-wheel brake cylinders for increased capacity.

PARKING BRAKE: True auxiliary brake . . . will not lock in position with engine running and car in gear . . . can be operated as a foot emergency brake while car is in motion. Automatically releases when transmission is placed in drive or reverse with engine running.

STEERING: Cadillac variable-ratio power steering with faster response and higher capacity pump is standard equipment (fixedratio on Seventy-Five models). Overall steering ratio of 16.6 to 1 (except 19.5 to 1 on Seventy-Five models and 16.3 to 1 on Eldorado). 38.5° turning angle provides fast response and short turning diameter.

FRAME: Perimeter frame with boxed side rails. New front members afford added protection with increased energy absorption.

TIRES: Low-pressure, size L78-15, bias-belted, fiberglass, tubeless, on all models. Black sidewalls, standard; white sidewalls available.

CORNERING LIGHTS: On the side of front fenders, activated by directional signal lever when headlamp switch is on. They project a beam of light from the side of the car, thus illuminating roadside and road signs for added convenience at night.

TREAD: Front 63.3", rear 63.3" (Eldorado, 63.66" front, 63.59" rear).

WHEELBASE: 130" (Fleetwood Sixty Special Brougham 133", Fleetwood Seventy-Five 151.5", Eldorado 126.3").

OVERALL LENGTH: 227.4" (Fleetwood Sixty Special Brougham 230.4", Fleetwood Seventy-Five 248.9", Eldorado 223.2").

NOTE: Richly textured vinyl is provided in certain areas of leather-trimmed Fleetwood and DeVille models.

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
